Imagination Library \$2,310 (77 children) | Kindergarten Camp \$3,354.93 Backpack Buddy \$8,900 (89 children) | Feeding Success \$500 | Summer Manufacturing Camp \$3,000

- **1.436 children (77 Hicksville)** from birth to age 5 are currently enrolled in **Imagination Library**, receiving 1 age appropriate book per month to their doorstep. We have graduated 853 children from the program and distributed over **40,000 books** since 2009.
- **2.28 children** participated in **Kindergarten Camp** in August 2018. Children were also given books and a \$10 Fruit & Vegetable Food Voucher.
- **3.89 bags of food** are bought and stuffed weekly by **Backpack Buddy** to provide food on the weekends for students enrolled in the Free & Reduced lunch program.
- **4.** Feeding Success food & personal care item pantries at the middle/high school. Partnered with Zonta Club & Women's Giving Circle.
- 5. Sponsored **60 students** to participate in the **Hicksville Summer Manufacturing Camp.** Skill development included soft skills, safety training, leadership & hands-on learning.
- 6. Available for Hicksville Students: County-Wide 528 students were educated about depression through Maumee Valley Guidance Center last school year. 299 Students were screened & 29 students were at risk for suicide.
- 7. Available for Hicksville Teachers & Staff: Youth Mental Health First Aid Training.
- 8. 327 lunches served to 37 children (unduplicated) in Hicksville through NOCAC's Summer Food & Fun program.
- 9. MyPlate nutrition program served to 3rd graders with our partners Defiance Co. Health Dept. & ADAMhS Bd.
- 10. Hidden in Plain Sight program has educated 467 people about the signs of drug use in their home since 8/17.
- 11. Assist in mentor recruitment for the **Mentoring Program**, with Ashley Sowder, Juvenile Probation.
- 12. Recruit around 5 volunteers (60 county-wide) to read & celebrate Dr. Seuss's birthday in classes K-2.
- 13. \$1,000 Youth Volunteer Scholarship Program through the Community Engagement Center.
- 14. Do you know someone that needs help with transportation, housing, food, or clothing? We fund a new Information and Referral line through **A Renewed Mind**. **DIAL 1-800-468-HELP**. (2-1-1 is no longer active.)
- 15. United Way of Defiance County funds 31 programs in Defiance County.
