

EVENTS & COLLABORATIONS

FEBRUARY: Hosted the 9th Trivia Night that sold out with 37 teams and raised \$8.031.90.

MARCH: Organized the Dr. Seuss Celebration and recruited 72 volunteers to local schools.

APRIL: Helped organize Healthy Kids Day with the Defiance Area YMCA where 200 kids learned about healthy activities & nutrition.
